Back to basics! The basic Copperplate lower case alphabet that is! If you'd like to participate in the FWCG September program, please bring the following:

- Pencil and Pointed pen staff and nib of your choice. You are welcome to use your pencil the entire program if you choose.
- Paper that you are able to see the guidelines underneath and a couple of paperclips to keep them together. Smooth paper works best with the pointed nib.
- Padding for underneath your paper (newspaper, several pieces of plain paper, piece of thin fun foam...you get the picture)
- Ink or mixed-up gouache.
- A couple Kleenex or small rag to wipe your nib off.
- The two handouts that were emailed to you. (Basic strokes and Guidelines with slant lines)

If you are already at ease with the pointed pen and the Copperplate lettering style, this will be a refresher for you. But if you haven't tried Copperplate, this is a good demo and possible start to get you on your way. Don't be afraid to try it. The pointed pen is an elegant and versatile hand that can be used for many projects.
